

SECOND CDM PROJECT FROM BANGLADESH REGISTERED WITH THE CDM EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE UNITED NATIONS

The second CDM project from Bangladesh entitled “ Composting of Organic Waste in Dhaka” has been registered with the CDM-Executive Board on May 18, 2006. Mentionably, this is the first composting project using CDM globally.

This project has been prepared by Waste Concern and the World Wide Recycling (WWR) of the Netherlands with support from the UNDP. This project is expected to reduce 89,259 tons of CO₂e per year. Earlier, World Wide Recycling and Waste Concern proposed a new methodology on methane emission reduction through composting which was also approved by the CDM-Executive Board last year.

An agreement for implementation of this project has since been signed between Dhaka City Corporation and World Wide Recycling/Waste Concern in January 2006. The project is expected to be operational by the last quarter of 2006.
